Summary (as of Jan 12, 2017)

Expresses the sense of the House of Representatives that: (1) Associate Justice Clarence Thomas is a historically significant African-American who has made an important contribution to U.S. jurisprudence, and (2) his life and work should have a prominent place in the National Museum of African American History and Culture.

Actions Timeline

- **Jan 31, 2017:** Referred to the Subcommittee on the Constitution and Civil Justice.
- **Jan 12, 2017:** Introduced in House
- **Jan 12, 2017:** Referred to the Committee on the Judiciary, and in addition to the Committee on House Administration, for a period to be subsequently determined by the Speaker, in each case for consideration of such provisions as fall within the jurisdiction of the committee concerned.
