Summary (as of Mar 21, 2018)

Safeguarding America's Skies Act of 2018

This bill amends the federal criminal code to authorize the Department of Homeland Security and the Department of Justice to detect, track, redirect, and disrupt an unauthorized unmanned aircraft to mitigate a safety or security threat to a facility or asset in the United States related to federal property, authorized protective operations, critical infrastructure, or other efforts.

Actions Timeline

- **Apr 30, 2018:** Referred to the Subcommittee on Crime, Terrorism, Homeland Security, and Investigations.
- **Apr 10, 2018:** Referred to the Subcommittee on Oversight and Management Efficiency.
- **Mar 22, 2018:** Referred to the Subcommittee on Highways and Transit.
- **Mar 21, 2018:** Introduced in House
- **Mar 21, 2018:** Referred to the Committee on the Judiciary, and in addition to the Committees on Transportation and Infrastructure, and Homeland Security, for a period to be subsequently determined by the Speaker, in each case for consideration of such provisions as fall within the jurisdiction of the committee concerned.
