Make State Governments More Open, Honest, and Transparent Act of 2017

This bill directs the head of a federal agency that administers any of specified block grant programs to suspend the authority of the state to administer funds under the program if the state does not enact or enforce at least one law that requires disclosure by a state legislator of financial interests, prohibits a legislator from soliciting political party or election campaign contributions, or prohibits the making or soliciting of contributions during a period of contractor performance or negotiations.

- **Feb 2, 2017:** Referred to the Subcommittee on Emergency Preparedness, Response and Communications.
- **Feb 1, 2017:** Referred to the Subcommittee on Human Resources.
- **Jan 17, 2017:** Referred to the Subcommittee on Aviation.
- **Jan 17, 2017:** Referred to the Subcommittee on Highways and Transit.
- **Jan 13, 2017:** Introduced in House
- **Jan 13, 2017:** Referred to the Committee on Energy and Commerce, and in addition to the Committees on Education and the Workforce, Financial Services, Homeland Security, the Judiciary, Transportation and Infrastructure, and Ways and Means, for a period to be subsequently determined by the Speaker, in each case for consideration of such provisions as fall within the jurisdiction of the committee concerned.

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
