Summary (as of Apr 19, 2018)

Preserving America's Infrastructure Dollars Act of 2018 or the PAID Act of 2018

This bill requires the Department of Transportation to require each state to conduct a life-cycle cost analysis for each project of the state that: (1) receives federal highway financial assistance; and (2) has an estimated total cost of \$30 million or more.

- **Apr 19, 2018:** Referred to the House Committee on Transportation and Infrastructure.
