Cuba Reconciliation Act

This bill amends: (1) the Foreign Assistance Act of 1961 to repeal the embargo placed upon all trade with Cuba, and (2) the Internal Revenue Code to declare the denial of foreign tax credit inapplicable to Cuba.

The bill permits: (1) installation and maintenance of telecommunications equipment and facilities in Cuba, including telecommunications services between the United States and Cuba; and (2) travel to and from Cuba by U.S. citizens or residents.

The U.S. Postal Service shall provide direct mail service to and from Cuba.

- **Feb 8, 2017:** Referred to the Subcommittee on Courts, Intellectual Property, and the Internet.
- **Feb 1, 2017:** Referred to the Subcommittee on Trade.
- **Jan 13, 2017:** Introduced in House
- **Jan 13, 2017:** Referred to the Committee on Foreign Affairs, and in addition to the Committees on Ways and Means, Energy and Commerce, Financial Services, the Judiciary, Oversight and Government Reform, and Agriculture, for a period to be subsequently determined by the Speaker, in each case for consideration of such provisions as fall within the jurisdiction of the committee concerned.
