This bill prohibits the use of any federal funds by the National Science Foundation to study:

- how Members of Congress set priorities within the constraints of the contemporary legislature;
- the relationship between Members in the sharing of guidance and informative documents; or
- the impact of such guidance and documents, including dear colleague letters, sent between Members.
