Border Wall Trust Fund Act

This bill authorizes the Department of the Treasury to accept donations to plan, design, construct, or maintain a barrier along the U.S.-Mexico international border.

The Department of Homeland Security shall provide for a commemorative display as an integrated part of the barrier recognizing individuals who contributed to the Border Wall Trust Fund established by this bill.

Actions Timeline

- **Jun 4, 2018:** Referred to the Subcommittee on Border and Maritime Security.
- **May 18, 2018:** Introduced in House
- **May 18, 2018:** Referred to the Committee on Homeland Security, and in addition to the Committee on Ways and Means, for a period to be subsequently determined by the Speaker, in each case for consideration of such provisions as fall within the jurisdiction of the committee concerned.
