Access to Infertility Treatment and Care Act

This bill amends the Public Health Service Act to require private health insurance plans that cover obstetrical services to also cover infertility treatments (e.g., in vitro fertilization). The bill also extends coverage to federal employees, members of the U.S. military, and veterans.

Actions Timeline

- **May 25, 2018:** Referred to the Subcommittee on Military Personnel.
- **May 24, 2018:** Introduced in House
- **May 24, 2018:** Referred to the Committee on Energy and Commerce, and in addition to the Committees on Oversight and Government Reform, Armed Services, and Veterans' Affairs, for a period to be subsequently determined by the Speaker, in each case for consideration of such provisions as fall within the jurisdiction of the committee concerned.
- **May 24, 2018:** Referred to the Subcommittee on Health.
