115 HR 6846	Related bill	Sep 27, 2018: Received in the Senate and Read twice and referred to the Committee on Homeland Security and Governmental Affairs.

This bill directs the U.S. Postal Service, by September 30, 2019, to designate a single, unique ZIP code for each of:

- Miami Lakes, Florida;
- Storey County, Nevada;
- Flanders, Northampton, and Riverside in the Town of Southampton, New York;
- Ocoee, Florida;
- Oakland, Florida;
- Glendale, New York; and
- Estero, Florida.
