AMBER Alert Nationwide Act of 2018

This bill makes several modifications to the AMBER Alert grant program, including to make all U.S. territories eligible for grants.

Additionally, the bill reauthorizes through FY2022 AMBER Alert grants for notification and communication systems along highways.

Actions Timeline

- **Jul 13, 2018:** Referred to the Subcommittee on Highways and Transit.
- **Jul 12, 2018:** Introduced in House
- **Jul 12, 2018:** Sponsor introductory remarks on measure. (CR H6121)
- **Jul 12, 2018:** Referred to the Committee on the Judiciary, and in addition to the Committees on Transportation and Infrastructure, and Appropriations, for a period to be subsequently determined by the Speaker, in each case for consideration of such provisions as fall within the jurisdiction of the committee concerned.
- **Jul 12, 2018:** Referred to the Subcommittee on Crime, Terrorism, Homeland Security, and Investigations.
