Establishing a Humane Immigration Enforcement System Act

This bill abolishes the U.S. Immigration and Customs Enforcement (ICE) no later than one year after enactment.

Congress must establish and convene the Commission to Study and Establish a Fair and Human System of Immigration and Customs Enforcement. The commission's duties shall include identifying all essential functions of ICE and ensuring that all immigration enforcement functions transferred to other agencies maintain strict compliance to the Constitution and applicable laws.

Actions Timeline

- **Aug 6, 2018:** Referred to the Subcommittee on Immigration and Border Security.
- **Jul 18, 2018:** Referred to the Subcommittee on Trade.
- **Jul 17, 2018:** Referred to the Subcommittee on Border and Maritime Security.
- **Jul 12, 2018:** Introduced in House
- **Jul 12, 2018:** Referred to the Committee on the Judiciary, and in addition to the Committees on Ways and Means, and Homeland Security, for a period to be subsequently determined by the Speaker, in each case for consideration of such provisions as fall within the jurisdiction of the committee concerned.
