Summary (as of Jul 12, 2018)

Invasive Fish and Wildlife Prevention Act of 2018

This bill addresses injurious wildlife (i.e., nonnative and invasive species), including by: (1) expanding the U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service's authority to regulate injurious wildlife, and (2) establishing the Injurious Wildlife Prevention Fund.

Actions Timeline

- **Aug 6, 2018:** Referred to the Subcommittee on Crime, Terrorism, Homeland Security, and Investigations.
- **Jul 27, 2018:** Referred to the Subcommittee on Water, Power and Oceans.
- **Jul 27, 2018:** Referred to the Subcommittee on Federal Lands.
- **Jul 16, 2018:** Referred to the Subcommittee on Trade.
- **Jul 12, 2018:** Introduced in House
- **Jul 12, 2018:** Referred to the Committee on Natural Resources, and in addition to the Committees on the Judiciary, Ways and Means, and the Budget, for a period to be subsequently determined by the Speaker, in each case for consideration of such provisions as fall within the jurisdiction of the committee concerned.
