Curtailing Lobbying and Empowering Americans for a New Politics Act of 2018 or the CLEAN Act of 2018

This bill modifies various lobbying restrictions and requirements.

Among other things, the bill does the following:

- broadens the scope of lobbying activities that trigger registration and disclosure requirements,
- limits bundled campaign contributions by lobbyists,
- prohibits congressional candidates from soliciting campaign contributions from lobbyists while Congress is in session, and
- requires certain agents of foreign commercial entities to register as lobbyists.

Actions Timeline

- **Oct 1, 2018:** Referred to the Subcommittee on the Constitution and Civil Justice.
- **Jul 25, 2018:** Introduced in House
- **Jul 25, 2018:** Referred to the Committee on House Administration, and in addition to the Committee on the Judiciary, for a period to be subsequently determined by the Speaker, in each case for consideration of such provisions as fall within the jurisdiction of the committee concerned.
