Summary (as of Sep 12, 2018)

Sustainable Water Supplies Act

This bill directs the Department of the Interior to enter into cooperative agreements with nonfederal entities to provide water supplies for:

- contractors for the Central Valley Project, California;
- units of the National Wildlife Refuge System;
- state wildlife areas;
- and private wetland areas.

Interior shall report on the long-term feasibility of these agreements to augment the federal water supply.

Actions Timeline

- **Sep 20, 2018:** Referred to the Subcommittee on Water, Power and Oceans.
- **Sep 12, 2018:** Introduced in House
- **Sep 12, 2018:** Referred to the House Committee on Natural Resources.
