Asia Reassurance Initiative Act of 2018

This bill provides for the promotion of U.S. values and diplomatic, security, and economic interests in the Indo-Pacific region. It includes statements of policy and measures concerning

- security assistance and alliances;
- the U.S. relationship with China, India, and the Association of Southeast Asian Nations;
- the U.S. military presence in the region, as well as the pursuit of arms control;
- security partnerships in southeast Asia;
- the commitment to Taiwan;
- a strategy regarding North Korea;
- trade agreements and facilitation; and
- the promotion of human rights and democracy in the region.

Actions Timeline

- **Oct 3, 2018:** Referred to the Subcommittee on Trade.
- **Sep 25, 2018:** Introduced in House
- **Sep 25, 2018:** Referred to the Committee on Foreign Affairs, and in addition to the Committees on Armed Services, Intelligence (Permanent Select), Ways and Means, the Judiciary, Financial Services, and Transportation and Infrastructure, for a period to be subsequently determined by the Speaker, in each case for consideration of such provisions as fall within the jurisdiction of the committee concerned.
