Bolts Ditch Access and Use Act

(Sec. 2) This bill directs the Department of Agriculture to permit by special use authorization nonmotorized access and use of the Bolts Ditch headgate and the Bolts Ditch within the Holy Cross Wilderness in Colorado for the diversion of water and use, maintenance, and repair of the ditch and headgate by the town of Minturn, Colorado.

- **May 9, 2017:** Placed on Senate Legislative Calendar under General Orders. Calendar No. 71.
- **Mar 30, 2017:** Committee on Energy and Natural Resources. Ordered to be reported without amendment favorably.
- **Feb 7, 2017:** Received in the Senate and Read twice and referred to the Committee on Energy and Natural Resources.
- **Feb 6, 2017:** Mr. Lamborn moved to suspend the rules and pass the bill.
- **Feb 6, 2017:** Considered under suspension of the rules. (consideration: CR H984-985)
- **Feb 6, 2017:** DEBATE - The House proceeded with forty minutes of debate on H.R. 689.
