Summary (as of Sep 28, 2018)

Protecting and Securing Chemical Facilities from Terrorist Attacks Act of 2018

This bill: (1) reauthorizes the Department of Homeland Security's Chemical Facility Anti-Terrorism Standards (CFATS) Program, and (2) establishes a CFATS Recognition Program with the goal of leveraging CFATS regulations and industry stewardship programs to further enhance security relating to hazardous chemicals.

Actions Timeline

- **Oct 17, 2018:** Referred to the Subcommittee on Cybersecurity and Infrastructure Protection.
- **Sep 28, 2018:** Introduced in House
- **Sep 28, 2018:** Referred to the Committee on Homeland Security, and in addition to the Committee on Energy and Commerce, for a period to be subsequently determined by the Speaker, in each case for consideration of such provisions as fall within the jurisdiction of the committee concerned.
