Rewriting to Improve and Secure an Exit Out of Poverty Act or RISE Out of Poverty Act

This bill reauthorizes and otherwise modifies the Temporary Assistance for Needy Families (TANF) program, including with respect to work requirements, qualified state expenditures, and procedures for addressing domestic and sexual violence among TANF recipients.

Actions Timeline

- **Oct 12, 2018:** Referred to the Subcommittee on Human Resources.
- **Oct 2, 2018:** Introduced in House
- **Oct 2, 2018:** Referred to the Committee on Ways and Means, and in addition to the Committee on Oversight and Government Reform, for a period to be subsequently determined by the Speaker, in each case for consideration of such provisions as fall within the jurisdiction of the committee concerned.
