Summary (as of Oct 26, 2018)

Clean Up the Code Act of 2018

This bill repeals specified sections of the federal criminal code, including provisions that prohibit the following:

- interstate transport of alligator grass, water chestnut plants, or water hyacinth plants;
- fraudulent use of the 4-H club emblem (i.e., the green four-leaf clover with stem);
- unauthorized use of the Smokey Bear character or name; and
- unauthorized use of the Woodsy Owl character, name, or slogan.

- **Dec 20, 2018:** Considered under suspension of the rules. (consideration: CR H10395-10396)
