Reducing Administrative Burden and Becoming Increasingly Transparent Act

This bill requires the Centers for Medicare & Medicaid Services to solicit feedback from the public, including providers, on certain Medicare administrative and regulatory issues.

Actions Timeline

- **Dec 17, 2018:** Referred to the Subcommittee on Health.
- **Dec 11, 2018:** Introduced in House
- **Dec 11, 2018:** Referred to the Committee on Ways and Means, and in addition to the Committee on Energy and Commerce, for a period to be subsequently determined by the Speaker, in each case for consideration of such provisions as fall within the jurisdiction of the committee concerned.
