Res. 811, the Chair put the question on ordering the previous question and by voice vote announced that the yeas had prevailed. Mr. McGovern demanded the yeas and nays, and the Chair postponed further proceedings on the question of ordering the previous question until later in the legislative day.
- **Apr 11, 2018:** Considered as unfinished business. (consideration: CR H3110-3112)
- **Apr 11, 2018:** On ordering the previous question Agreed to by the Yeas and Nays: 231 - 186 (Roll no. 133). (consideration: CR H3110-3111)
- **Apr 11, 2018:** Passed/agreed to in House: On agreeing to the resolution Agreed to by recorded vote: 230 - 184 (Roll no. 134).(text: CR H3105)
