Sets forth the rule for consideration of H.R. 6157 (Department of Defense Appropriations Act, 2019).

Makes it in order to consider concurrent resolutions providing for adjournment during July 2018.

- **Jun 27, 2018:** Considered as privileged matter. (consideration: CR H5759-5765)
- **Jun 27, 2018:** DEBATE - The House proceeded with one hour of debate on H. Res. 964.
- **Jun 27, 2018:** POSTPONED PROCEEDINGS - At the conclusion of debate on H.Res. 964, the Chair put the question on ordering the previous question, and by voice vote, announced that the ayes had prevailed. Mrs. Torres demanded a recorded vote and the Chair postponed further proceedings on ordering the previous question until a time to be announced.
