Summary

(as of Jun 15, 2020)

This resolution expresses the sense of the House of Representatives that the United States can achieve a more perfect union

- through avoidance of *government speech* (as the state of Texas did in *Walker III v. Texas Division, Sons of Confederate Veterans, Inc.*) that promotes or displays symbols, signs, and vestiges of racism, oppression, and intimidation;
- by abating the use of government speech through signs, actions, and words that promote division and tear at the fabric of American society; and
- by taking actions to ensure that government speech does not foster division, disharmony, or intolerance through government-issued or sponsored flags, signs, images, or other symbols.
