Social Media Use in Clearance Investigations Act of 2019

This bill directs the Office of Management and Budget to report on the examination of social media activity during security clearance investigations.

Actions Timeline

- **Feb 12, 2019:** Received in the Senate and Read twice and referred to the Committee on Homeland Security and Governmental Affairs.
- **Feb 11, 2019:** Ms. Hill (CA) moved to suspend the rules and pass the bill.
- **Feb 11, 2019:** Considered under suspension of the rules. (consideration: CR H1498-1499)
- **Feb 11, 2019:** DEBATE - The House proceeded with forty minutes of debate on H.R. 1065.
