Summary (as of Sep 15, 2020)

This resolution

- expresses support for the designation of National Voting Rights Month,
- encourages people to uphold the right to vote,
- commemorates the 100th anniversary of the passage and ratification of the Nineteenth Amendment to the Constitution,
- encourages Congress to pass certain voting rights legislation,
- recommends the development of a curriculum in public schools and universities regarding voting,
- encourages the U.S. Postal Service to issue a special John Lewis stamp during the month of September, and
- invites Congress to allocate funds for public service announcements regarding elections.

Actions Timeline

- **Sep 24, 2020:** Referred to the Subcommittee on Cybersecurity, Infrastructure Protection, and Innovation.
- **Sep 15, 2020:** Introduced in House
- **Sep 15, 2020:** Referred to the Committee on the Judiciary, and in addition to the Committees on House Administration, Intelligence (Permanent Select), Oversight and Reform, Science, Space, and Technology, Education and Labor, Ways and Means, Financial Services, Ethics, and Homeland Security, for a period to be subsequently determined by the Speaker, in each case for consideration of such provisions as fall within the jurisdiction of the committee concerned.
