- **Oct 1, 2020:** Introduced in House
- **Oct 1, 2020:** The House Committee on Rules reported an original measure, H. Rept. 116-557, by Ms. Scanlon.
- **Oct 1, 2020:** Rule provides for consideration of H. Res. 1153 and H. Res. 1154 with 1 hour of general debate. Previous question shall be considered as ordered without intervening motions. Measure will be considered read. Bill is closed to amendments.
- **Oct 1, 2020:** Placed on the House Calendar, Calendar No. 96.
- **Oct 1, 2020:** Considered as privileged matter. (consideration: CR H5123-5136)
- **Oct 1, 2020:** DEBATE - The House proceeded with one hour of debate on H. Res. 1164.
- **Oct 1, 2020:** POSTPONED PROCEEDINGS - At the conclusion of debate on H. Res. 1164, the Chair put the question on ordering the previous question and by voice vote, announced that the ayes had prevailed. Mrs. Lesko demanded the yeas and nays and the Chair postponed further proceedings on ordering the previous question until a time to be announced.
- **Oct 1, 2020:** Considered as unfinished business. (consideration: CR H5435-5437)
- **Oct 1, 2020:** On ordering the previous question Agreed to by the Yeas and Nays: 226 - 187 (Roll no. 215). (consideration: CR H5435-5436)
- **Oct 1, 2020:** Passed/agreed to in House: On agreeing to the resolution Agreed to by the Yeas and Nays: 226 - 186 (Roll no. 216).
