### Summary (as of Feb 14, 2019)

This bill establishes the Nonpartisan Commission on Immigration Reform and Border Security. The commission shall assess and report to Congress on U.S. border security and the immigration system in general. The bill directs the commission to consider certain topics, including (1) vulnerabilities in border screening and surveillance; (2) cross-border criminal activity; (3) protocols pertaining to migrant families, asylum seekers, and refugees; (4) the Deferred Action for Childhood Arrivals program; and (5) naturalization.

- **Mar 25, 2019:** Referred to the Subcommittee on Immigration and Citizenship.
- **Mar 8, 2019:** Referred to the Subcommittee on Border Security, Facilitation, and Operations.
- **Feb 14, 2019:** Introduced in House
- **Feb 14, 2019:** Referred to the Committee on the Judiciary, and in addition to the Committees on Homeland Security, and Rules, for a period to be subsequently determined by the Speaker, in each case for consideration of such provisions as fall within the jurisdiction of the committee concerned.
