This bill requires the Department of Energy (DOE) to establish a funding program to facilitate the commercialization of energy and related technologies that exhibit promising commercial potential and are developed at DOE facilities.

- **Aug 16, 2019:** Committee on Energy and Natural Resources. Reported by Senator Murkowski under authority of the order of the Senate of 08/01/2019 without amendment. With written report No. 116-76.
- **Aug 16, 2019:** Placed on Senate Legislative Calendar under General Orders. Calendar No. 178.
- **Jul 16, 2019:** Committee on Energy and Natural Resources. Ordered to be reported without amendment favorably.
- **May 2, 2019:** Introduced in Senate
- **May 2, 2019:** Read twice and referred to the Committee on Energy and Natural Resources.
