Tribal Marijuana Sovereignty Act of 2019

This bill prohibits the federal government, when determining a Native American tribe's eligibility for funds, benefits, or contracts, from considering the tribe's authority to produce, purchase, or possess marijuana on tribal lands.

The Indian Health Service's medical professionals may make medical recommendations to their patients with regard to marijuana.

Actions Timeline

- **Mar 18, 2019:** Referred to the Subcommittee for Indigenous Peoples of the United States.
- **Mar 1, 2019:** Referred to the Subcommittee on Health.
- **Feb 27, 2019:** Introduced in House
- **Feb 27, 2019:** Referred to the Committee on Natural Resources, and in addition to the Committee on Energy and Commerce, for a period to be subsequently determined by the Speaker, in each case for consideration of such provisions as fall within the jurisdiction of the committee concerned.
