116 HR 5301	Identical bill	Jan 30, 2020: Referred to the Subcommittee on Crime, Terrorism, and Homeland Security.

This bill modifies the criminal prohibition on possession of a firearm in a school zone.

Specifically, it revises an exception to permit an individual to possess a firearm in a school zone if that individual is in compliance with the laws of the state and political subdivision in which the school zone is located.
