Summary (as of Apr 1, 2019)

Coordinating and Leveraging Activities for School Security Act or the CLASS Act of 2019

This bill establishes in the Department of Homeland Security a council to ensure the coordination of activities, plans, and policies to enhance the security of schools and preschools against acts of terrorism.

Actions Timeline

- **Apr 2, 2019:** Received in the Senate and Read twice and referred to the Committee on Homeland Security and Governmental Affairs.
- **Apr 1, 2019:** Mr. Thompson (MS) moved to suspend the rules and pass the bill, as amended.
- **Apr 1, 2019:** Considered under suspension of the rules. (consideration: CR H2929-2930)
- **Apr 1, 2019:** DEBATE - The House proceeded with forty minutes of debate on H.R. 1593.
