## **Keeping Russian Entrapments Minimal and Limiting Intelligence Networks Act or the KREMLIN Act**

This bill directs the Office of the Director of National Intelligence (ODNI) to provide Congress with assessments of the current intentions of Russia and its leaders. Specifically, the ODNI shall assess (1) the potential for Russian military action against North Atlantic Treaty Organization (NATO) countries, (2) possible Russian responses to an increased U.S. or NATO military presence in Eastern Europe, and (3) areas where Russia could exploit weaknesses and divisions among the governments of its Western adversaries.

- **Mar 13, 2019:** Received in the Senate. Read the first time. Placed on Senate Legislative Calendar under Read the First Time.
- **Mar 12, 2019:** Mr. Krishnamoorthi moved to suspend the rules and pass the bill.
- **Mar 12, 2019:** Considered under suspension of the rules. (consideration: CR H2664-2665)
- **Mar 12, 2019:** DEBATE - The House proceeded with forty minutes of debate on H.R. 1617.
- **Mar 12, 2019:** Passed/agreed to in House: On motion to suspend the rules and pass the bill Agreed to by voice vote.(text: CR H2664-2665)
- **Mar 12, 2019:** On motion to suspend the rules and pass the bill Agreed to by voice vote. (text: CR H2664-2665)
- **Mar 12, 2019:** Motion to reconsider laid on the table Agreed to without objection.
- **Mar 7, 2019:** Introduced in House
- **Mar 7, 2019:** Referred to the Committee on Intelligence (Permanent Select), and in addition to the Committee on Foreign Affairs, for a period to be subsequently determined by the Speaker, in each case for consideration of such provisions as fall within the jurisdiction of the committee concerned.
