Actions Timeline

- **Mar 25, 2019:** Referred to the Subcommittee on Crime, Terrorism, and Homeland Security.
- **Mar 1, 2019:** Referred to the Subcommittee on Consumer Protection and Commerce.
- **Feb 28, 2019:** Introduced in House
- **Feb 28, 2019:** Referred to the Committee on Energy and Commerce, and in addition to the Committees on the Judiciary, and Education and Labor, for a period to be subsequently determined by the Speaker, in each case for consideration of such provisions as fall within the jurisdiction of the committee concerned.

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
