Appalachian Regional Commission Relocation Act

This bill requires the headquarters of the Appalachian Regional Commission to be located in the Appalachian region.

The commission must implement this requirement within one year, but may extend the implementation period by up to 180 days with written notice to Congress.

Actions Timeline

- **Feb 7, 2019:** Referred to the Subcommittee on Economic Development, Public Buildings, and Emergency Management.
- **Jan 3, 2019:** Introduced in House
- **Jan 3, 2019:** Referred to the House Committee on Transportation and Infrastructure.
