Diesel Emissions Reduction Act of 2019

This bill reauthorizes through FY2024 a diesel emissions reduction program under which the Environmental Protection Agency provides grants, rebates, or loans for replacing diesel engines or retrofitting the engines with pollution control technologies.

Actions Timeline

- **Dec 18, 2019:** Read twice and referred to the Committee on Environment and Public Works.
- **Sep 10, 2019:** Received in the Senate.
- **Sep 9, 2019:** Mr. Rush moved to suspend the rules and pass the bill.
- **Sep 9, 2019:** Considered under suspension of the rules. (consideration: CR H7541-7543)
- **Sep 9, 2019:** DEBATE - The House proceeded with forty minutes of debate on H.R. 1768.
- **Sep 9, 2019:** At the conclusion of debate, the Yeas and Nays were demanded and ordered. Pursuant to the provisions of clause 8, rule XX, the Chair announced that further proceedings on the motion would be postponed.
- **Sep 9, 2019:** Considered as unfinished business. (consideration: CR H7547-7548)
