## **DHS Acquisition Documentation Integrity Act of 2019**

This bill establishes additional requirements for Department of Homeland Security (DHS) acquisitions that are estimated to require total expenditures of at least \$300 million.

These requirements include

- meeting certain criteria for acquisition documentation, such as validated operational requirements;
- preparing cost estimates and schedules in a manner consistent with best practices identified by the Government Accountability Office; and
- an annual comprehensive report on the status of DHS acquisitions.

## **Actions Timeline**

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- **May 15, 2019:** Received in the Senate and Read twice and referred to the Committee on Homeland Security and Governmental Affairs.
- **May 14, 2019:** Ms. Torres Small (NM) moved to suspend the rules and pass the bill.
- **May 14, 2019:** Considered under suspension of the rules. (consideration: CR H3759-3761)
- **May 14, 2019:** DEBATE - The House proceeded with forty minutes of debate on H.R. 1912.
- **May 14, 2019:** Passed/agreed to in House: On motion to suspend the rules and pass the bill Agreed to by voice vote.(text: CR H3759-3760)
- **May 14, 2019:** On motion to suspend the rules and pass the bill Agreed to by voice vote. (text: CR H3759-3760)
