Summary (as of Apr 1, 2019)

Equity for Disaster Victims Act of 2019

This bill assists victims of Superstorm Sandy and other disasters by allowing recipients of specified disaster-assistance loans from the Small Business Administration to repay the loans with disaster-recovery grant funds received under the Community Development Block Grant Program.

Actions Timeline

- **Apr 2, 2019:** Referred to the Subcommittee on Economic Development, Public Buildings, and Emergency Management.
- **Apr 1, 2019:** Introduced in House
- **Apr 1, 2019:** Referred to the Committee on Small Business, and in addition to the Committees on Financial Services, and Transportation and Infrastructure, for a period to be subsequently determined by the Speaker, in each case for consideration of such provisions as fall within the jurisdiction of the committee concerned.
