Studying the Missing and Murdered Indian Crisis Act of 2019

This bill requires the Government Accountability Office to report on the response of law enforcement agencies to reports of missing or murdered Native Americans and to make recommendations on how to improve the utilized databases and notification systems.

Actions Timeline

- **May 15, 2019:** Referred to the Subcommittee on Crime, Terrorism, and Homeland Security.
- **Apr 23, 2019:** Referred to the Subcommittee for Indigenous Peoples of the United States.
- **Apr 2, 2019:** Introduced in House
- **Apr 2, 2019:** Referred to the Committee on the Judiciary, and in addition to the Committee on Natural Resources, for a period to be subsequently determined by the Speaker, in each case for consideration of such provisions as fall within the jurisdiction of the committee concerned.
