This bill requires the Federal Bureau of Investigation (FBI) to provide quarterly briefings to Congress about the FBI's counterintelligence activities.

The FBI shall promptly notify Congress of any counterintelligence investigation regarding a candidate seeking nomination or election for federal office or any campaign or individual related to such a candidate.

### Actions Timeline

---

- **May 20, 2019:** Referred to the Subcommittee on Crime, Terrorism, and Homeland Security.
- **Apr 10, 2019:** Introduced in House
- **Apr 10, 2019:** Referred to the Committee on the Judiciary, and in addition to the Committee on Intelligence (Permanent Select), for a period to be subsequently determined by the Speaker, in each case for consideration of such provisions as fall within the jurisdiction of the committee concerned.
