Summary (as of Apr 25, 2019)

Prenatal Nondiscrimination Act of 2019 or the PRENDA Act of 2019

This bill creates new federal crimes related to the performance of sex-selection abortions (i.e., abortions based on the sex or gender of an unborn child).

It subjects a violator to criminal penalties—a fine, a prison term of up to five years, or both.

It also authorizes civil remedies, including damages and injunctive relief.

A woman who undergoes a sex-selection abortion may not be prosecuted or held civilly liable.

Actions Timeline

- **May 20, 2019:** Referred to the Subcommittee on the Constitution, Civil Rights, and Civil Liberties.
- **Apr 25, 2019:** Introduced in House
- **Apr 25, 2019:** Referred to the House Committee on the Judiciary.
