Clean Water Infrastructure Resilience and Sustainability Act

This bill requires the Environmental Protection Agency to establish a grant program for increasing the resilience of publicly owned treatment works (i.e., clean water infrastructure) to natural disasters.

Actions Timeline

- **May 3, 2019:** Referred to the Subcommittee on Water Resources and Environment.
- **May 2, 2019:** Introduced in House
- **May 2, 2019:** Referred to the House Committee on Transportation and Infrastructure.
