## **American Indian and Alaska Native Child Abuse Prevention and Treatment Act or AI/AN CAPTA**

This bill implements requirements concerning child abuse and neglect in Indian tribal communities. Specifically, the bill requires the Government Accountability Office to report on child abuse and neglect in tribal communities for the purpose of making recommendations regarding these issues.

Additionally, the Department of Health and Human Services must include Indian tribes and tribal organizations in its equitable distribution of assistance for programs and projects related to child abuse prevention and treatment.

### **Actions Timeline**

- **May 16, 2019:** Referred to the Subcommittee for Indigenous Peoples of the United States.
- **May 7, 2019:** Introduced in House
- **May 7, 2019:** Referred to the Committee on Education and Labor, and in addition to the Committee on Natural Resources, for a period to be subsequently determined by the Speaker, in each case for consideration of such provisions as fall within the jurisdiction of the committee concerned.
