Summary (as of May 8, 2019)

Oxybenzone and Octinoxate Impact Study Act of 2019

This bill requires the Environmental Protection Agency to study the impact of oxybenzone and octinoxate (chemicals commonly found in sunscreens) on public health and the environment, including marine life.

Actions Timeline

- **May 22, 2019:** Referred to the Subcommittee on Water, Oceans, and Wildlife.
- **May 9, 2019:** Referred to the Subcommittee on Environment and Climate Change.
- **May 8, 2019:** Introduced in House
- **May 8, 2019:** Referred to the Committee on Energy and Commerce, and in addition to the Committee on Natural Resources, for a period to be subsequently determined by the Speaker, in each case for consideration of such provisions as fall within the jurisdiction of the committee concerned.
