Servicewomen's Health Transition Training Act of 2019

This bill requires U.S. military service departments to encourage separating and retiring female service members to participate in the Women's Health Transition Training Program, which provides information on care available from the Department of Veterans Affairs.

The bill requires military installations that have specified centers for transition assistance to advertise the program.

Actions Timeline

- **Jun 12, 2019:** Referred to the Subcommittee on Health.
- **Jun 12, 2019:** Referred to the Subcommittee on Economic Opportunity.
- **May 24, 2019:** Referred to the Subcommittee on Military Personnel.
- **May 23, 2019:** Introduced in House
- **May 23, 2019:** Referred to the Committee on Veterans' Affairs, and in addition to the Committee on Armed Services, for a period to be subsequently determined by the Speaker, in each case for consideration of such provisions as fall within the jurisdiction of the committee concerned.
