This concurrent resolution expresses recognition that foreign assistance programs are critically important for promoting U.S. national security, demonstrating the United States' humanitarian spirit, and improving the country's international standing. The resolution also states that the goal should be to spend at least 1% of U.S. gross domestic product each year for nonmilitary foreign assistance.
