### Summary (as of Dec 19, 2019)

#### Native Behavioral Health Access Improvement Act of 2019

This bill provides funds for and requires the Indian Health Service (IHS) to award grants to Indian health facilities for the prevention and treatment of mental health and substance use disorders. The IHS must establish a technical assistance center for grantees.
