Responsible Disposal Reauthorization Act of 2019

This bill extends through FY2031 authorization for the Department of Energy to operate the Cheney disposal cell in Mesa County, Colorado. (The disposal cell serves as a repository for mill tailings, which is sandy waste that results from the process of turning natural uranium into fuel.)

- **Mar 6, 2019:** Received in the Senate and Read twice and referred to the Committee on Energy and Natural Resources.
- **Mar 5, 2019:** Mr. Tonko moved to suspend the rules and pass the bill.
- **Mar 5, 2019:** Considered under suspension of the rules. (consideration: CR H2329-2330)
