Summary (as of Jun 27, 2019)

Ensuring Safe Capital Access for All Small Businesses Act of 2019

This bill removes cannabis from the schedule of controlled substances, and it prohibits the Small Business Administration from declining to provide certain small business loans to an eligible entity solely because it is a cannabis-related legitimate business or service provider.

Actions Timeline

- **Jul 30, 2019:** Referred to the Subcommittee on Crime, Terrorism, and Homeland Security.
- **Jul 19, 2019:** Referred to the Subcommittee on Conservation and Forestry.
- **Jul 16, 2019:** Referred to the Subcommittee on National Parks, Forests, and Public Lands.
- **Jun 28, 2019:** Referred to the Subcommittee on Health.
- **Jun 27, 2019:** Introduced in House
- **Jun 27, 2019:** Referred to the Committee on Small Business, and in addition to the Committees on Energy and Commerce, Natural Resources, Agriculture, and the Judiciary, for a period to be subsequently determined by the Speaker, in each case for consideration of such provisions as fall within the jurisdiction of the committee concerned.
