This bill establishes the National Center for the Right to Counsel. The purpose of the center is to provide support for the following:

- public defense systems, and
- training programs to improve the delivery of legal services to indigent defendants.

Actions Timeline

- **Aug 6, 2019:** Referred to the Subcommittee on Crime, Terrorism, and Homeland Security.
- **Jul 12, 2019:** Introduced in House
- **Jul 12, 2019:** Referred to the Committee on the Judiciary, and in addition to the Committee on Ways and Means, for a period to be subsequently determined by the Speaker, in each case for consideration of such provisions as fall within the jurisdiction of the committee concerned.
