National Commission To Investigate the Treatment of Migrant Families and Children Act of 2019

This bill establishes the National Commission to Investigate the Treatment of Migrant Families and Children By the Trump Administration within the legislative branch. The commission shall report on the actions of the Department of Homeland Security and the Department of Health and Human Services, specifically in relation to individuals apprehended along the U.S.-Mexico border since January 2017.

Actions Timeline

- **Aug 12, 2019:** Referred to the Subcommittee on Immigration and Citizenship.
- **Aug 6, 2019:** Referred to the Subcommittee on Border Security, Facilitation, and Operations.
- **Jul 16, 2019:** Introduced in House
- **Jul 16, 2019:** Referred to the Committee on the Judiciary, and in addition to the Committee on Homeland Security, for a period to be subsequently determined by the Speaker, in each case for consideration of such provisions as fall within the jurisdiction of the committee concerned.
